3. **ADMISSION: All persons must have a ticket or pass to enter.**
 - a. **General Admission Tickets:**

First Round (school sites)	Adults – \$6	Students – \$4

 - b. **Season Tickets:** *Good at Pendleton Convention Center only.* Adults – \$60 Students – \$30
 - c. **Online Tickets:** www.osaa.org/tickets/
Pre-order Season Tickets for the 2A Basketball State Championship. Tickets are available online until 10 a.m., March 2. All orders will be placed at the event site Will Call window and available for pick-up beginning March 4, 12:30 p.m.
 - d. **Member School Discount Tickets:** Tickets are good for all games, first round through finals site. Each school may purchase up to 12 discount tickets for \$30 each. **DO NOT** punch **Discount Tickets** in the playoff rounds. The sessions are for the final site only.
 - e. **Administrative Complimentary Tickets:** Each school that participates in a state championship match will receive the following complimentary tickets: Superintendent, 2; Principal, 2; Athletic Director, 2.
 - 1) The *host school* is to provide these tickets for all games prior to the final site.
 - 2) The OSAA office will provide these tickets at the final site. Schools may pick up their tickets at the coaches' meeting or we will place them at the "Will Call" window in the name of the school. **Photo ID and a signature will be required to pick up tickets at "Will Call."** No additional coaches' passes will be available at the championship site. Coaches may gain admission with their OACA Gold Card and photo ID.
 - 3) Administrative Complimentary tickets should be used to supervise your student sections when your team is participating.
 - f. **Bus Drivers:** Schools are responsible for all bus driver admissions. The OSAA does not provide passes for bus drivers.
 - g. **Passes:** ONLY the OSAA Gold Card, OSAA VIP, OSAA Media, Basketball Media, and Basketball Discount tickets, which will admit the bearer only with photo ID, are to be honored at any OSAA State Championship event. No school, athletic district, officials association, etc., passes are to be accepted.
 - h. **Gates – Finals Site Only:** Gates will open one hour prior to each session.
4. **EXPENSES:** www.osaa.org/forms/ReimbursementFormula.pdf
Team expenses will be paid by check at the conclusion of the winter sports season according to the 2008-09 Reimbursement Formula.

5. **LODGING AND VISITOR INFORMATION:** Schools are to make their own arrangements for lodging.
- a. **Teams and Organized Groups:** Teams may reserve rooms for their teams directly with their preferred lodging properties.  - b. **Visitor Information:** Visit the Pendleton Chamber of Commerce online or call them at 800.547.8911 for more information about dining, shopping, lodging, and more while in Pendleton.
6. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – PEP BAND EXPECTATIONS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*):
- a. “The purpose of performances by pep bands at athletic events is to entertain, promote school spirit and support cheerleaders in providing positive crowd participation activities. All members of the band are expected to exhibit the highest standards of good sportsmanship.
 - b. Amplified instruments are permitted at basketball contests unless the State Championship Director determines that space availability or distance to an electrical outlet precludes its use. The State Championship Director has the authority to control the volume of any amplified instrument.
 - c. Musical selections may be performed only during the following times:
 - 1) Prior to the game.
 - 2) During time outs.
 - 3) Between quarters or at halftime.
 - 4) Following the game.
 - 5) Exceptions:
 - a) No musical selections may be performed during injury time outs.
 - b) Rhythmic percussion cadences in support of cheerleaders promoting positive crowd participation are acceptable during the game except during free throws or injury time outs.
 - d. If two pep bands are playing at an athletic contest, the groups shall alternate performances and split the half time. In football, the performance time after a touchdown or point after goes to the band representing the school that has scored regardless of which band performed last. The directors of the two groups shall meet prior to the contest to confirm how the time will be shared for that particular event. *(Fall 2000)*
 - e. The band director must accompany and verify each pep band member for complimentary admission to sessions in which your school is playing. The band should enter as a group using the NE entrance.
 - f. Please be reminded that pep bands are to remain in their respective designated areas. If musical instruments are stored on the bus, the bus should be locked or an adult attendant provided.
 - g. A single small-amplified instrument will be permitted at the discretion of the State Championship Director. Please bring your own extension cords. Microphones will not be permitted in the band area. Due to some spectator and team seating locations, we ask your cooperation in keeping the sound level reasonable. **Bring tape to cover wires.**
 - h. Based on electrical outlets available the State Championship Director and the Fire Marshall’s ruling will make the final decision.
7. **CHEERLEADING – SQUAD SIZE LIMITATIONS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*):
- A. “If a school has more than one varsity cheerleading squad, the cheerleaders representing the school at an event shall be limited to persons who are members of the varsity squad for that sport season.
 - B. The number of cheerleaders permitted at State Basketball Championships is as follows:
 - 1) 6A, 5A – One advisor and a maximum of 16 members of the varsity cheerleading squad in uniform, including mascots, shall be admitted free of charge.
 - 2) 4A, 3A, 2A, 1A – One advisor and a maximum of 12 members of the varsity cheerleading squad in uniform, including mascots, shall be admitted free of charge.
 - 3) Schools may buy tickets for additional cheerleaders but may not place more than the maximum number cited above on the sidelines at any one time.

- D. Squad size for routines performed prior to the contest, during time outs and for halftime entertainment may exceed the maximum limit so long as the additional members return to the stands when the contest resumes.”
(Revised Spring 2006)
- e. Cheerleaders are to enter as a group using the NE entrance.
- f. In some instances, cheerleading squads remain too close to the playing floor during play. For the protection of all concerned, cheerleading squads must take a position as indicated by the State Championship Director that will not interfere with the game as played.

8. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – BASKETBALL HALFTIME ENTERTAINMENT** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies):

- a. “Schools participating in the Basketball State Championships will be given first choice to entertain during halftime intermission of all basketball games. Other schools will be considered in order of application received.
- b. All halftime entertainment must be approved by the State Championship Director.
- c. Each group will be admitted free to the session at which it performs. (A session is two games). However, cheerleading squads of participating schools in the Basketball State Championships choosing to perform at halftime still are required to pay admission beyond the varsity complimentary passes available.
- d. Individuals or groups shall provide their own tape and tape recorder for music accompaniment. (It shall be understood that schools not participating in the state championships shall not bring a band.)
- e. Total halftime entertainment shall not exceed eight minutes.
- f. Participating schools are to mutually agree on how the eight-minute halftime is to be shared.
- g. The facilities will not be blacked out nor will fire of any nature be permitted for entertainment.
- h. Individuals or groups must wear appropriate gym floor shoes.
- i. Questions concerning halftime entertainment shall be directed to the State Championship Director.”
- j. An advisor shall accompany and verify members of the entertainment group that will be performing in the session in which their school plays. For complimentary admission, enter as a group using the center entrance.
- k. Any school wishing to play music through the master sound system for halftime entertainment is urged to utilize a cassette tape recorder or CD player. Arrangements must be made through the State Championship Director prior to the state championship.

9. **SPECTATOR CONDUCT AT OSAA SANCTIONED EVENTS:** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

“In addition to the general expectations included in the OSAA Constitution, Rule 3, that school officials “...shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that the school’s students and supporters maintain a sportsmanlike attitude toward all events...” the following specific expectations regarding spectator conduct **at all OSAA sanctioned events, including regular and post season competition**, are provided: (Revised Fall 2008)

- a. **All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one’s team. No cheers, comments or actions shall be directed at one’s opponent or at contest officials. Some examples of inappropriate conduct or actions that are not permitted are: turning backs, holding up newspapers or jeering at cheerleaders during opposing team introductions; disrespecting players by name, number or position; negative cheers or chants; throwing objects on the floor.** (Revised Fall 2008)
- b. Spectators are not permitted to have signs or banners (larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches), confetti, balloons or glass containers. Spectators are required to wear shirts.
- c. Spectators are not permitted to have artificial noisemakers. Some examples of artificial noisemakers are Thunder Stix, cowbells, clappers and air horns.
- d. Spectators shall not be permitted to use vulgar/offensive **or racially/culturally insensitive** language. **Spectators shall not be permitted to engage in any racially / culturally insensitive action.** (Revised Fall 2008)

10. **CHAMPIONSHIP GAME – KEEPING STUDENTS OFF THE PLAYING FLOOR:** In the past, injuries have occurred when students rushed onto the floor. We ask that you inform your student rooters that this practice will not be allowed. Schools are expected to have ample personnel available in student sections to monitor this situation. Additional security personnel will be on hand to assist in keeping students off the floor.

11. **SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD:** This award will be presented to the participating school, which displays the best overall sportsmanship both on and off the court. The school, coaches, players, cheerleading squads, pep bands and

spectators are all considered in the judging. A special committee will choose the schools to receive this honor. The sportsmanship guideline for judging the award is enclosed for your information.

12. **DAMAGE TO BACKBOARD AND/OR FACILITY:** Administrators are urged to inform all players and students never to grasp the net during warm-up sessions or during and after the regular game. It should be understood that if any damages are caused by students, the member school represented by such player or student shall assume all liability to replace and/or repair such damaged equipment. Further, any damage to the facility such as walls, chairs, etc. could also be charged to the school. For your school's protection, please help us inspect your student seating sections prior to and after your team plays. This could prevent your school from receiving a bill for damages.
13. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – VIDEOTAPING** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*): "Any school or spectator may videotape state championships from the stands, providing they do not obstruct the view of others or require extra space. Use of a tripod in the stands is prohibited for safety reasons. When a school films its own team during a state championship, the official school representative will be granted the privilege of filming from the press box or other designated area established by the OSAA. NOTE: Videotaping or filming is for private use only. Televising, including live or delayed broadcasts and cable, is prohibited unless a contract is signed with the OSAA."
14. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – RADIO, TELEVISION AND INTERNET BROADCASTS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*): "The OSAA owns the rights to and coordinates any radio, television and/or Internet broadcasts for state championship events, first round through championship final. Media outlets that wish to broadcast any state championship event must contact the OSAA for permission and/or to negotiate a rights fee well in advance of the event. The OSAA shall contact the host school athletic director if a media outlet has been granted permission to broadcast an early round event. If the OSAA has not contacted the host school athletic director to confirm that permission has been granted, the broadcast shall not be allowed. It shall be the responsibility of the media outlet to make all necessary arrangements with the host school athletic director and to pay for any phone line charges or installation fees for any early round event. The OSAA will coordinate arrangements with media outlets at all final sites." (Revised Fall 2007)

COACH / TEAM INFORMATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS - TEAM SIZE** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*): "The following limitations shall apply to replacement players and maximum team sizes for **team sport** State Championship events, first round through championship final.

Penalties for excessive team size: Suiting up or playing too many players shall be considered a gross act of unsportsmanlike conduct punishable by fines, forfeiture and / or other penalties as determined by the OSAA Executive Board.
(Revised September 2006)

B. Basketball. Team: Replacement of players applies to each game. A player replaced on the roster may be reinstated to the roster in subsequent games. Maximum in uniform: **6A – 14; All other classifications – 12. (Revised Fall 2008).**"
2. **OFFICIAL BALL ADOPTION:**
 - a. **Boys** - The official ball for all playoff and championship games will be the Wilson Evolution B0516.
 - b. **Girls** - The official ball for all playoff and championship games will be the Wilson Evolution B0586.
 - c. Due to contractual obligation, the OSAA will mandate use of these balls for all state championship games, first round through final sites. It is the host school's responsibility to provide an official Wilson basketball for games at home sites. Wilson basketballs will be provided at state championship final sites by the OSAA.

FIRST ROUND

1. **OFFICIALS:** Two officials will be assigned and paid by OSAA through the commissioner. Commissioners have been instructed to contact the host school AD to reconfirm game times and locations prior to the day of the contest.
2. **PRACTICE TIME:** All practice arrangements at first round sites must be made by the schools.

CHAMPIONSHIP SITE INFORMATION – Pendleton Convention Center

1. **PRACTICE TIME:** No practice time is available at the state championship site for participating teams. All practice arrangements at other sites must be made by schools.

2. **COACHES' MEETING:** A coaches' meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, March 4 at 11 a.m. (boys coaches) and Thursday, March 5 at 11 a.m. (girls coaches). All schools must have a representative at one of these meetings. Head coaches are encouraged to attend.
3. **COACHES' PACKETS:** Packets will be available at the championship site and are to be picked up at the coaches meeting. Each packet will contain 16 participant passes, including coaches and athletic trainer.
 - a. A pass for the athletic trainer will be available only at the request of the athletic director.
 - b. Schools may pick up their Complimentary Tickets at the coaches' meeting or we will place them at the "Will Call" window in the name of the school.
 - c. No additional coaches' passes will be available at the championship site. Coaches may gain admission with their OACA Gold Card and photo ID.
 - d. Schools are responsible for taking care of any bus driver admissions.
4. **PARKING:** There is a designated area for team buses and vans; enter by the Dairy Queen. Entry will be by permit only. Two Parking Permits will be included in your coaches' packet. This area is designated for teams that are participants in the current session – all other teams should park in the main lot or other designated areas.
5. **SEATING:** **Seating on the bench is limited to 15 chairs**, which includes players, coaches, managers, and athletic trainers. No one from your team is permitted to sit behind the benches or on the floor.
6. **DOCTOR / ATHLETIC TRAINER:** On call at each site. Teams must provide their own first aid supplies. When called upon to evaluate an injury at the tournament, his/her decision prevails as the final decision.
7. **TOWELS:** Towels will not be available or issued at the championship site.
1. **COOLERS:** The OSAA will provide a Gleukos cooler for use by each bench at the State Championship final site. The coolers will contain water and ice. Teams can put other drinks (sports drinks, etc.) in the coolers provided by the OSAA. No other coolers will be allowed on the sidelines. To prevent spills, open cups will not be permitted on the court. Water bottles are permitted.
8. **AWARDS:** Team trophies will be presented at the conclusion of each trophy game on Saturday. The sportsmanship award, all-tournament team recognition, second place and championship trophies and medals and championship bracket board will be presented at the conclusion of each gender's final game Saturday evening.
 - a. **Trophies:** Champion through sixth place trophies will be presented to the top teams in each gender.
 - b. **Medals:** Fifteen medals will be presented to both the champion and second place teams in each gender.
 - c. **U.S. Bank/Les Schwab Tires All-Tournament Teams:** Medals will be presented to members of the All-Tournament 1st and 2nd Teams in each gender (five members on each team).
 - d. **Qwest Player of the Game:** One player from each team in each of the 22 final site games will be recognized as that team's Qwest Player of the Game. The winners will be announced over the PA and will receive a certificate and commemorative gift from Qwest the week following the championships. The certificate and gift will be mailed to the student's athletic director.
9. **NET CUTTING:** Cutting the net will be allowed only as part of the awards ceremony. Safety dictates that site management will provide a ladder and scissors for the championship team.

 Results for the early rounds will be posted to the official OSAA brackets each evening during the playoffs. Complete game boxscores, along with updated brackets, will be posted immediately following each game at the finals site. CHEERLEADER COMPETITION

Two Cheerleader Squad trophies (one boy's and one girl's) will be awarded to the best Cheerleader Squad at the tournament in Pendleton. The trophies will be awarded according to the following principles:

Criteria for Judging:

- Difficulty of maneuver; including style and originality.
- Personality of group; enthusiasm, etc.
- Precision-execution and details of movements.
- Uniformity of group; hair, uniforms, etc.

No facilities are available for dressing. A public restroom (no mirrors) can be used. Arrangements for protecting personal belongings should be made.

HALFTIME ENTERTAINMENT

1. Criteria for judging
 - a. Style and originality.
 - b. Personality of group, enthusiasm, etc.
 - c. Precision-execution and detail of movements.
 - d. Uniformity of group; hair, uniforms, etc.
2. The group's routine should be a maximum of four minutes in length (including entrance and exit). If the group runs over the allotted time, the music will be stopped by the Tournament Director and the team will be expected to leave the floor immediately.
3. No facilities are available for dressing. A public restroom (no mirrors) can be used. Arrangements for protecting personal belongings should be made.
4. Special facilities and props needed should be arranged for in advance. The State 2A Committee will assist in making arrangements if notified ahead of time. The type of music used is to your discretion. The PA system will be available for your use. Please have cassette tapes queued to the proper place. Arrange the playing of your music with the PA announcer well ahead of the time you are to perform.
5. Material needed by the announcer to introduce the group, should be available in advance to the tournament performance and be typed. Please word this material exactly as you wish it announced.
6. Please fill out the OSAA Halftime Entertainment Request and send it back to the return addressee. Also, take note of the policy statement on the form.

PEP BAND AWARD

All schools represented in the 2A Boys & Girls Basketball State Championships are encouraged to bring "Pep Bands" with them. There will be one award given to the pep band that is judged the best band at the tournament. The bands would be judged as follows:

1. Tournament Pep and Sportsmanship.
2. Uniformity of Group.
3. Musical Ability.
 - a. Balance
 - b. Tone Quality
 - c. Tuning
