SUBJECT: Update of OSAA State Championship Committee Work Session – February 22, 2010

The OSAA State Championship Committee held a six-hour work session at the OSAA office on February 22, 2010. The Committee started by reviewing all written correspondence that had been received since the Committee last met on February 1. What followed was an extensive discussion of possible State Championship recommendations to the Executive Board for the 2010-2011 school year.

OVERVIEW:

COMMITTEE CHARGE: The Committee continued to be mindful of the general charge from the OSAA Constitution, and the specific charge from the Executive Board to consider recommendations that answer the following questions:

- What changes would the State Championship Committee recommend be implemented to help reduce financial pressures on member schools and the Association?
- What changes would the State Championship Committee recommend be implemented to strengthen the competitive level of the teams/individuals in the championship events?

REGIONALIZATION: During discussion, the Committee reached consensus on several overriding concepts regarding regionalization of individual sports.

- A workable approach to satisfying the charge of strengthening competitive levels at state championship events in individual sports is to restrict the number of state championship participants by inserting a regional qualifying event between the district level and state level contests. In order to treat all individual sports equitably, all individual sports should have regional events.
- Traditional district qualification models for state level participation do not work well for “hybrid” leagues with schools from multiple classifications. Regional events offer equitable access to state level participation for schools that have been placed in “hybrid” leagues.
- Some sports lend themselves better to different approaches to regionalization. If it is likely that it will be necessary to use league/special district meets to restrict the quantity of participants at the regional event (i.e. wrestling), the regional event for that sport should be defined by the leagues/special districts feeding into the region. In other sports, if the regional event is likely to be less restrictive in number of entries (i.e. cross country), it is not necessary that the regions reflect league/special district configuration.
- In some sports at certain classifications (i.e. 3A and 2A/1A wrestling), current leagues/special districts already function as regional qualifying events, so further regionalization is unnecessary.
- If there will be a significant difference in the number of participants, the number of state qualifiers from each region should be adjusted.

CONSOLATION CONTESTS: School and community support of consolation contests in basketball and volleyball varies significantly between the upper classification and lower classification final sites. The distinction is so great as to justify differential treatment for the different classifications.

OSAA CALENDAR: The Committee is considering recommending that the OSAA Calendar be modified to reduce overlap between sports seasons. An example approach, which would shift the first practice and contest dates for Winter and Spring sports one week later, but NOT shift the championship contest dates for those seasons, is attached. Other potential changes to cutoff dates and playoff round dates for each sport are shown on this example approach. (SEE ATTACHMENT)

6A-5A-4A: Discussion at the work session did not alter the Committee’s continuing support for the concept of “play-in” games for team sports at 6A-5A-4A classification levels. The Committee appreciates and expects continuing suggestions in that regard from 6A-5A-4A classification representatives.

3A-2A-1A: The Committee discussed playoff allocations at the 3A and 2A classifications and came up with the following proposals based on the number of teams in a league while recognizing weekly participation limitations in football. Playoff allocations at the 1A classification would remain at three per league.

POWER RATING SYSTEM: The Committee continues to support the concept of the development of a Power Rating system to be used to place teams once they have qualified to the OSAA State Championship brackets. The Committee didn’t discuss power ratings at this meeting but is interested in receiving feedback in this area prior to the March 15 public meeting:

- A system containing a defined point structure for wins and losses that differentiates between home, away and neutral site games based on an opponent’s winning percentage or number of games the opponent has won. The system will need to continually adjust as an opponent’s record changes throughout the regular season.
- A system that does not penalize a school for playing an opponent from the next lower classification level but may reward a team for playing an opponent from a higher classification.
- A system that can be adapted to account for games played against out of state opponents and junior varsity teams from higher classifications.
- A system that does not factor in a score differential.
- A system that does not incorporate coaches polls, media polls, or voting mechanisms of any type.
- A system that can be integrated with a score reporting component so that re-calculation of the Power Rating can be viewed by the schools and the public as the season progresses.

SPORT BY SPORT PROPOSED RECOMMENDATIONS:

BASKETBALL: The Committee supports keeping final site events at eight teams per gender, but proposes the elimination of consolation games (except for a 3rd place game) at the 6A, 5A, 4A, 3A classifications. The Committee supports no changes to the 2A, 1A classification final sites.

VOLLEYBALL: The Committee supports keeping final site events at eight teams per classification, but proposes the elimination of consolation games (except for a 3rd place match) at the 6A/5A and 4A/3A final sites. The Committee supports no changes to the 2A/1A final site.

District meets and tournaments in individual sports will no longer be exempt from OSAA participation limitations. Regional qualifying events will be exempt from the participation limitation for that sport.

CROSS COUNTRY: The Committee supports the concept of regional cross country events. All teams in a region would be able to participate in the regional. Qualifiers to state may vary by region based on number of participants in the regional. Note the increase in the number of 4A regions from three to four. (SEE ATTACHMENT)

SWIMMING. The Committee supports a regional qualifying concept, and is awaiting an anticipated proposal from swimming representatives that includes both a regional qualification and a reduction in participants.

WRESTLING. Implement regional qualifying at all classification levels with 3A and 2A/1A utilizing current special districts as qualifying regions. Also, the Committee supports modifying the wrestling Individual Participation Limitations to allow 14 team events, 18 individual weigh-ins and a total of 45 mat appearances exclusive of regionals and state championships. (SEE ATTACHMENT)

GOLF. The Committee supports regional qualifying events with leagues/special districts being combined into regions. Leagues/special districts would conduct a district tournament and would advance 3 teams and 5 individuals not on those three teams to the regional. Regionals would be one day, 18 hole contests in order to control costs for schools and make it more manageable for golf course sites. Qualifiers to state may vary by region based on number of participants in the regional. (SEE ATTACHMENT)

TENNIS. The Committee supports a regional qualifying concept, and is awaiting an anticipated proposal from tennis representatives that includes both a regional qualification and a reduction in participants.

TRACK & FIELD. The Committee supports a regional qualifying concept, and is awaiting an anticipated proposal from track and field representatives that includes both a regional qualification and a reduction in participants.

The OSAA staff will provide a Committee update, similar to this one, to all superintendents, principals, and athletic directors following each meeting.
