SUBJECT: Summary of Executive Board Action at the September 8, 2008, Meeting

At the meeting on September 8, 2008, the OSAA Executive Board took the following actions:

- Approved the minutes of the May 5 and July 29 Board Meetings.
- Adopted the 2008-2009 OSAA Handbook.
- Approved the membership of the 2008-2009 OSAA Eligibility Appeals Board.
- Received a 2007-2008 State Championship Revenue update from Executive Director Tom Welter.
- Received a preliminary report on the 2007-2008 OSAA Audit from Executive Director Tom Welter.
- Amended the 2008-2009 Operating Budget to reflect a higher than expected increase in insurance premiums.
- Voted to retain the Excess Revenue from the 2005-2006 school year to compensate for an anticipated deficit in the final 2007-2008 audit.
- Adopted the Golf and Tennis Special District alignments for 2008-2009. (osaa.org/golf/ or osaa.org/tennis/)
- Adopted the 2008-2009 Playoff Reimbursement Formula which includes an additional step for schools traveling more than 700 round trip miles for an OSAA event and an increase in the team size limitations for 6A schools. . (Attached)
- Adopted the 2008-2009 Ticket Prices which include a \$1.00 increase in Adult Ticket prices for sites administered by the OSAA. (Attached.)
- Approved the roster of members of the 2010-1014 Classification and Districting Committee. (Attached)
- Adopted the Charge to the 2010-1014 Classification and Districting Committee. (Attached)
- Adopted the Association Goals for 2008-2009. (Attached.)
- Denied though lack of action a request from the Western States Chiropractic College that a representative of the chiropractic community be included on the OSAA Medical Aspects of Sport Committee.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Article 4.2 "Delegate Assembly Qualifications" and Article 5.2.1 "Executive Board Qualifications" to increase the number of potentially eligible applicants.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Article 6.2 "Changes in Classification During the Four-Year Time Block" to specify that any request from a school to the Classification and Districting Committee to "play up" shall be for the duration of the four-year time block.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 1 "Responsibility of the Principal" to delete the requirement that principals submit a Seasonal Eligibility Report.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 1.2 "Athletic Director and Coach Certification" to require that all coaches be certified.



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- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 5 “Violations of Regulations – Penalties” to allow the Board more penalty options in the case of the use of an uncertified coach.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 5 “Violations of Regulations – Penalties” to increase the maximum fine for each violation from \$1,000 per violation to \$2,500 per violation.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 6 “Association Year – Sports Seasons” to shift the authority to add or delete a sport from the Board to the Delegate Assembly, and to increase the threshold level for adding or deleting a sport above the 1A classification from participation of 50% of the schools within a classification to 75% of the schools within a classification. (The proposal leaves the threshold level for the 1A classification at current 50% level.)
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 6.1.2 “Fall Sports Contest Dates” to move the first contest date five days earlier, and remove the option to play an early contest/jamboree.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 8.1 “Attendance – Semester – Grades” to raise individual academic eligibility standards and specify yearly Minimum Satisfactory Progress Requirements”. (Attached)
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 8.6.3 (e) “Exceptions to Fundamental Rule” to disallow immediate eligibility for a student who transfers to a Boarding School after being previously eligible as a participant in a CSIET approved foreign exchange program.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 20 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 8.5 “School Representation” to specify that students attending alternative schools run by a public school district or students attending private alternative schools registered with the State Department of Education shall be held to the same school representation rules as students attending private schools or non-member charter schools.
- Received a first reading of a proposal to delete Board Policy # 5 “Athletic Directors and Coach Recommendation Timelines”. The proposal will be an action item at the December 8 Board Meeting.
- Received a first reading of a proposal to amend Board Policy #44 “Football – Summer Team Contact Camp” to apply the policy to “any Summer event in which protective equipment is utilized during person-to-person contact.” The proposal will be an action item at the December 8 Board Meeting.
- Requested that the Officials Fee Review Committee investigate and make recommendations regarding the issues of Minimum Mileage Fees and fee levels for 6A/5A/4A and 3A/2A/1A playoff contests.
- Approved a request from Madras High School to be allowed six quarters of participation in football for the 2008-2009 school year.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Coaches Association (OACA) report from OACA Co-Executive Director Dave Johnson.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Directors Association (OADA) report from OADA Representative to the OSAA Board Craig Rothenberger.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Officials Association (OAOA) report from OAOA Executive Director Jack Folliard.
- Received a Fall Administrator Workshops report from Public Relations Assistant Kyle Stanfield.
- Received a Cheerleading Safety Clinic report from Associate Executive Director Mike Wallmark.
- Received an Associate Member School report from Executive Director Tom Welter.
- Received a Cooperative Sponsorships report from Public Relations Assistant Kyle Stanfield.



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- Received an Endowment Games report from Assistant Executive Director Peter Weber.

Expenses incurred by teams traveling during the state championships are paid at the conclusion of each sports season (fall, winter, spring.) Checks will be mailed to schools upon completion of the NFHS Participation Survey.

- A. Reserved Seating
 - 1. Only schools offering reserved seating for regular season games may sell reserved seats for playoff games. Schools cannot increase the price of reserved seats for the playoffs. Regardless of what the school charges, the OSAA must receive their regular ticket price of \$6.
 - 2. If schools have not had reserved seating during regular season play, they may not institute such a policy for playoffs.
- B. There is no admission charged to spectators at the Tennis, Golf, Solo Music, or Speech State Championships.

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Charge to the Classification and Districting Committee for the 2010-2014 Time Block

HANDBOOK CHARGE: The 2008-2009 OSAA Handbook, Article 9.2, "Classification and Districting Committee" states,

9.2.1 Charge. The Committee shall make recommendations to the Executive Board regarding classifications and districts for the upcoming four-year time block. The duties and responsibilities of the Committee shall be:

- A To hold public hearings and provide correspondence to interested parties regarding classifications and districts for the upcoming four-year time block.
- B To hear testimony from any school or other interested party, including information on the numbers of students currently enrolled in grades 8, 7 and 6.
- C To make recommendations to the Executive Board regarding classifications and districts and enrollment limits for the upcoming four-year time block.
- D To consider the following criteria, among any others they deem relevant, for recommending placement of schools in athletic districts:
 - (1) The Committee shall always consider:
 - a) Enrollment;
 - b) Geographic location of the school (including additional costs of travel and potential loss of class time);
 - c) Participant safety;
 - d) School preference, including "play up/play down" requests;
 - e) Creation of similar sized leagues;
 - f) Placement of schools within the same school district and classification in the same league;
 - (2) The Committee may also consider the following, among any other issues they deem relevant:
 - a) Scheduling problems;
 - b) Athletic district history;
 - c) Move as few schools as possible;

ADDITIONAL CHARGE: The OSAA Board further requests that the Classification and Districting Committee for 2010-2014 investigate and report regarding the feasibility and advisability of:

- A. Increasing league sizes.
- B. Improving public/private competitiveness.
- C. Adjusting individual ADM based upon socio-economic status.

OSAA GOALS FOR 2008 – 09

1. **FINANCIAL OBJECTIVE** – Ensure the long-term financial stability of the Association.

Strategy:

- A. Carefully review budgets and expenditures before and after each OSAA State Championship event to ensure financial stability.
- B. Work with Foundation Board of Directors to monitor Endowment Game revenues and other contributions to the Foundation and to recommend programs to receive Foundation funding.
- C. Continue to search for new corporate partners to provide the Association with additional financial resources.

2. **OPERATIONS OBJECTIVE** – Continually monitor OSAA operations to successfully meet the needs of member schools and affiliated organizations.

Strategy:

- A. Work with the State Board of Education and Department of Education to evaluate and analyze requests for accommodation resulting from the recent Oregon Supreme Court ruling regarding religious discrimination.
- B. Work with member schools to implement the Spectator Conduct Committee recommendations that were approved by the Executive Board and Delegate Assembly.
- C. Implement the Classification & Districting Committee to review the classifications, enrollments and league placements of all member schools.
- D. Monitor member schools to ensure compliance with OSAA requirements (coaches education certification, fall practice plan, wrestling weight control).

3. **COMMUNICATION OBJECTIVE** – Increase the frequency and effectiveness of communication with member schools, media, legislature and the general public.

Strategy:

- A. Continue to improve the Association website (osaa.org) in order to better serve the needs of member schools, staff, media and fans.
- B. Implement the new contract with FSN Northwest that should provide additional exposure to the Association and its member schools.
- C. Continue to work with OSAA lobbyist to foster positive relations with key members of the State Legislature.

Proposal to Amend Rule 8.1 – “Attendance – Semester – Grades” to Raise the Individual Eligibility Academic Standards

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board sponsor a change to Rule 8.1 – “Attendance – Semester – Grades” to raise the OSAA individual eligibility academic standards?

RATIONALE: Current OSAA individual eligibility academic standards should be strengthened to encourage greater emphasis on and encouragement of academic progress toward graduation.

Rule 8 Individual Eligibility

8.1. **Academic Eligibility.** ~~Attendance-Semester-Grades.~~

Rule: An eligible student must be enrolled full time **and making satisfactory progress toward graduation** as defined in this rule.

Rationale: The objective of the **academic eligibility** ~~minimum semester academic credit~~ rule is to complement member schools’ curriculum programs in recognition of the fact that interscholastic activity programs are an extension of the classroom. Academic standards help ensure a balance between activities and academic performance, promote the objective of graduation from high school, ensure that student participants are truly representing the academic mission of the institution, and allow the use of interscholastic participation as a motivator for academic excellence. It is in the interests of the member schools and the students participating in athletics and interscholastic activities that these objectives be promoted during the entire school year.

8.1.1. **Full Time Enrollment.**

Definition of “full time enrollment”. For purposes of this rule, a full time student is one who is enrolled in high school, attending regularly and passing in ~~subjects~~ **courses offered by a high school, college, work experiences or other school-approved educational activities (including summer school or night school)** equivalent to at least the quantity listed on the appropriate line of the chart below, and who during the immediate preceding semester was enrolled in school, attended regularly and passed subjects equivalent to at least the quantity listed on the appropriate line of the chart below. ~~A home school student who transfers to a public or private school may establish initial academic eligibility by achieving a minimum score on the achievement test required annually at the end of the school year of all home school students wishing to participate in activities. NOTE: In a traditional setting, two-semester units equals one credit of work, and one-half credit is granted each semester.~~

EXCEPTION: The requirement for immediate preceding semester credit is inapplicable to a student who has not previously enrolled in any high school offering the 10th, 11th or 12th grades.

(a) ~~**Period of Eligibility.**~~ If the school enters grades/credits on the official transcript each semester/trimester/quarter, that is the time period of eligibility of students attending that school. **(ADD to Q&A's)**

8.1.2. Satisfactory Progress Toward Graduation. In addition to the specific credit requirement identified in Rule 8.1.1., to be scholastically eligible, a student must **also** be making satisfactory progress towards the school's graduation requirements ~~as determined by the local school administration~~ **by earning a minimum of the quantity of credits indicated on the chart below for the specified year.**

~~**8.1.3.** A semester, as used in these Rules, is one-half of the regular school year.~~

~~**8.1.4.** Where a student is enrolled in a high school and receiving credit at that high school for off-campus college classes, work experiences or other school-approved educational activities (including summer school or night school), the school may count those credits earned off-campus for the purposes of determining individual eligibility.~~

~~**8.1.5.** Credits earned during the summer or as a result of submitting work to satisfy requirements for classes for which an incomplete grade was assigned shall be deemed to have been completed during the previous semester for the purpose of determining individual eligibility.~~

8.1.3 Home school student academic eligibility.

(a) **Minimum Test Score.** A home school student who transfers to a public or private school may establish initial academic eligibility by achieving a minimum score on **any adopted achievement test pursuant to ORS 339.035. The student shall achieve a minimum composite test score that places the student at or above the 23rd percentile based on national norms.**

(b) **Test Deadline.** **The achievement test must be completed prior to August 15th each year.**

- (c) **Work Sample Alternative.** *In the absence of achievement test results submitted by the deadline of August 15th each year, a school district may adopt alternative requirements including but not limited to a requirement that a student submit a portfolio of work samples to a school district committee for review to determine whether a student is eligible to participate interscholastic activities.*

8.1.4 Hardship exceptions to this Rule. ~~(subject to application and approval by the Executive Director)~~ *The Executive Director, in individual cases may, at his/her discretion and upon terms and conditions he/she may impose, waive or modify this rule when in his/her opinion there are circumstances beyond the control of both the student and the student's parent(s) or other circumstances whereby enforcement of the rule would work an undue hardship upon the student.*

Factors which may be considered by the Executive Director include the following:

- (a) Forced absence due to illness or injury as certified in writing by a licensed physician, shall excuse regular attendance for the period of such forced absence, and where such forced absence entirely prevents completion of the semester, shall excuse completion of the required subjects.
- (b) Any student with an Individualized Educational Program (IEP) who, primarily because of the student's disability,
- (1) did not pass the appropriate number of classes, per Rule 8.1.1., in the immediately preceding semester,
 - (2) is not currently enrolled in and passing the appropriate number of classes, per Rule 8.1.1., and/or
 - (3) has not been attending school regularly, may still be eligible to participate if the student's IEP team determines that the student is making adequate educational progress towards meeting the student's IEP goals and objectives.

A decision of the Executive Director may be appealed to the Executive Board. A decision of the Executive Board may be appealed to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction under OAR 581-021-0035.
