

## O8MFH OVERVIEW

Oregon 8-man football began in 1960. It replaced 6-man football after 1959. There are approximately 36 states that sponsor 8-man teams. In most states the 8-man field width is 40 yards, 13½ yards narrower than the 53½ yard standard 11-man field. Most states continue to play on a 100 yard field. Other states opt for 80 yard lengths. Oregon is one of a few states that play 8-man on a regulation size field making the Oregon 8-man game entertaining to watch largely in part because of its wide open fast pace.

OSAA, the governing body of athletics and activities in Oregon places schools in classifications based on enrollment and other criteria. This is done at the start of a new time block which occurs every 4 years. Over the years the face of Oregon 8-man football has changed. Schools with decreasing enrollments have moved down a classification to play 8-man football, while others have moved up from 8-man to play 11-man. OSAA uses those enrollment figures and other criteria to place schools in 6 different classifications which dictates which leagues and special districts schools participate in. In the past 62 years we have seen 8-man schools that closed or merged with another school. Examples of these are 1962 state champ Hereford closed. 1962 runner-up Canyonville merged with South Umpqua. 1965 state champ St. Francis (Baker City) closed. 1963 runner-up Eagle Valley merged with Pine Valley and is now Pine Eagle. Schools with small enrollments are allowed to co-op (merge) with another school that has small enrollments to form one team. (see list of schools) who have had a co-op in the 62 years of Oregon 8-man football. Examples of schools who have moved down a classification to play 8-man football

due to a decrease of enrollments and/or criteria set by OSAA: Mapleton, McKenzie and Lowell in the 2000's. North Douglas and Yoncalla in the 2010's also did this for the same reasons.

Imbler and St. Paul are examples of schools who began playing 8-man in 1960, then moved up to play 11-man as per enrollment increase or a change in cut-off numbers. In later years they moved back down to again play 8-man. Culver and Sherman Co. are other examples. Culver is currently playing 2A football (11-man) and Sherman Co. is playing 6-man football in a new pilot program currently formed by OSAA in 2018. The 2018 season saw schools playing 11-man in the 2A classification given an opportunity to play 8-man. This was due for the most part because of win-loss percentages that were low, and also low participation numbers. Football schools choosing to play down in 2018 were Waldport, Myrtle Point, Oakridge, Pilot Rock, Union, Enterprise and Bonanza. OSAA is set to review these schools after two years and determine if said schools will continue to play 8-man, or move back up in 2A and play 11-man again.

Dufur is the only school to field an 8-man team for 62 consecutive years (1960-2021), at least from records we could find.

## O8MFH BY THE DECADES

After compiling this list on 08MFH from 1960-2021, it's fair to say that Oregon 8-man football has been a game of "streaks and runs" as shown by looking at the game and breaking it down by the decades.

#### 1960's

• Ione started the 1960's by winning the inaugural 8-man state championship game in Oregon, defeating Triangle Lake, Triangle Lakes only appearance in the finals to date. Sisters defeated the 1960's champion Ione in 1961. Sisters only 8-man state championship after many 6-man titles in the 1950's and titles in 11-man in the late 1990's (1998-99). Sisters closeds runner-up. Camas Valley won back to back titles in 1963-64, Eagle Valley (closed) and Weston (closed) were runner-up. St.Francis (closed) won in 1965, Wheeler runner-up. In 1966 Riverside (3A) and Wheeler were co-champs. Prospect won its first title in 1967 with many more final appearances to come by defeating Prairie City. Closing the 1960's, Huntington won back to back titles in 1968-69 on the way to four straight, defeating Mohawk and Prospect.

## 1970's

Huntington started the decade the way they finished the 1960's by going back to back in 1970-71 defeating Butte Falls and Detroit on their way to the four-peat. Huntington also played in the finals in 1973, losing to Butte Falls. Alsea won in 1972, defeating lone. Culver won three straight from 1974-76. Prospect was in the finals in two of these years 1974 and 1975. Mohawk finished second in 1976. Arlington won its first state championship in 1977,

defeating Prospect. Ione finished the decade by going back-to-back defeating MacLaren (Woodburn) in 1978, and Prospect in 1979. The 1970's saw Prospect finish second four times, 1974, 1975, 1977, then again in 1979.

### 1980's

Camas Valley started in the 80's by beating Arlington. Arlington came back in 1981 to win the state championship with Prospect being runner-up. 1982 saw Prospect break a string of second place finishes by winning a co-state title with Cove. This was Cove's first title with many more to come in the 1980's. Cove goes back to back winning in 1983, defeating Valsetz (closed), Valsetz's one and only title appearance. St. Paul defeated Cove in 1984, marking St. Paul's first state title. In 1985 Cove defeated St. Paul as well as in 1987. In 1986 Butte Falls defeats Cove. 1988 saw Paisley make its first and only title appearance, losing to Cove. That year was Cove's 7th straight title game from 1982-88, a Oregon High School state football record. Sherman Co. closed the decade by defeating Alsea in 1989. In O8MFH the 80's saw Cove arguably have the best decade ever going 104-13-1.

### 1990's

Camas Valley started the decade by defeating Prairie City. That 1990 game was played at Parker Stadium (Reser) on the Oregon State Campus. This marked the first year that an Oregon 8-man championship game was played at a neutral site. It also marked the first time the game was played on artificial

turf (field turf). St. Paul won back to back titles in 1991-92. In 1991 they defeated Sherman Co., and in 1992 they defeated Dufur, Dufur's first title appearance. Wallowa defeated St. Paul in 1993 ending the Buckaroos 40 game win streak from 1990-1993. Wallowa's first 8-man state title. 1994 saw Dufur defeat Powers, marking Dufur's first state championship. In 1995 the Rangers defeated Eddyville to go back to back. It was Eddyville's only state title appearance. From 1996-1998 Powers won three straight. They defeated league rival Days Creek in 1996, Days Creek's only title appearance to date. In 1997 Powers defeated Culver, and in 1998 they defeated Crane. Dufur finished the decade by defeating St. Paul in 1999. The 1990's saw Dufur and Powers win three titles each, St. Paul two. This marked the Jack Henderson era at Dufur High School. The 2021 season marked the 35th season for Coach Henderson, having started in 1987.

#### 2000's

Dufur started the 2000's by defeating Powder Valley in the 2000 state championship, and St. Paul in 2001, completing a three-peat! 2002 saw St. Paul defeat league rival Perrydale, Perrydale's first finals appearance. Powder Valley defeated Powers in 2003, Powder Valley's first state championship to date. Perrydale won the 2004 title by beating McKenzie. 2005 and 2007 saw Mohawk win titles, beating South Wasco Co. in 2005 and Imbler in 2007. Dufur defeated Perrydale in 2006. Imbler won the title in 2008, defeating league rival Joseph, Joseph's first and only title appearance to date, and Imbler's first 8-man title. St. Paul closed the decade by defeating Imbler in the 2009 title game. Dufur, St. Paul, Imbler, and Perrydale played in 3 finals.

#### 2010's


St. Paul started the 2010's the way they finished the 2000's by defeating Camas Valley in the 2010 game. Camas Valley then defeated Perrydale in the 2011 title game and went back to back defeating St. Paul in the 2012 game. In

2013 Imbler won the title, defeating Lowell, Lowell's first state title appearance to date. Adrian won its first 8-man title, defeating Sherman Co. in 2014. From 2015-18 Dufur won four consecutive titles. They defeated Crane in 2015 and 2016. In 2017 they defeated Hosanna Christian in the title game. This makes Hosanna Christian's first title appearance. In 2018 Dufur completes the four-peat defeating St. Paul tying Huntington with 4 consecutive state championships! Adrian finishes the decade of the 2010's defeating St. Paul 38-32 in the championship game, Adrian's second title of the decade. Dufur and St. Paul played in 4 finals in the 2010's, Camas Valley 3.

### 2020's

The 2020 season was postponed due to the global pandemic and no state champion was crowned. The 2021 season saw Adrian defeat Powder Valley in the championship. Adrian won in 2019 and 2021.

## O8MFH JACK HENDERSON ERA



The late 1980's and early 1990's marked the Jack Henderson Era at Dufur High School. The 2021 season marked the 35th season for Coach Henderson, having started in 1987. Prior to Jack's arrival at Dufur High School the Rangers had qualified for the state playoffs 2 times in 27 years, 1963 and 1967. Dufur failed to make playoffs from 1987-1991. From 1992-2021 (29 years), the Rangers have qualified 27 times, failing to do so only 1997 and 2009. During that period Dufur football has played in 11 state championship games, winning 10 of them with a 90.9 winning

percentage in championship games. Coach Henderson is #1 on the Oregon 8-man coaches list for all-time wins with a record of 286-99-0. Jack is also #1 in the nation (NFHS) for all time wins in 8-man football. Coach Henderson ranks #7 on the Oregon high school list for all-time wins for all classifications. "H" has been named 1A coach of the year multiple times in Oregon along with being named 2018 WFHS National Coach of the Year for 8-man football. His 10 state football championships at Dufur are 3 more than St. Mary's Larry Walkers (retired) 7, more than any coach regardless of classification in the state of Oregon. Jack currently serves on the OSAA Executive Board, serving his second term.




