- 4. FIRST / SECOND ROUND ADMISSION:
 - A. Ticket Prices (Excluding Service Fees): Student is any child age 5 & up through a senior in high school.

First Round (school sites)

Adults – \$8

Students - \$5

- B. *First / Second Round school sites* will have digital ticketing available but <u>may</u> also accept physical transactions the day of the event at the host facility.
- C. Digital tickets may be purchased through <u>HomeTown Ticketing</u> on the OSAA website, <u>www.osaa.org/shop/tickets</u>, <u>or</u> through the OSAA Live Mobile App, www.osaa.org/app.
 - 1) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser is agreeing to follow the Oregon Health Authority State Mandates in effect at the time of the event.
- 5. FINALS SITE ADMISSION:
 - A. <u>University of Portland Bag Policy / Prohibited Items</u>: <u>www.up.edu/events/know-before-you-go</u>

Backpacks, duffle bags, or bags larger than 12 x 12 x 6 are prohibited. Please review this policy and information regarding bag checks and prohibited items (i.e., outside food and beverages, tobacco use, umbrellas, etc.). Every effort will be made to be to as quick and efficient as possible, but fans are encouraged to arrive well in advance of the scheduled start time in order to allow ample time to enter the facility.

B. Vaccination & Mask Requirements

All fans aged 12 and older attending games at all University of Portland Athletics events must show proof of vaccination against COVID-19 or provide proof of either a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 72 hours of the event or a negative lab-based rapid test taken within 48 hours of the event. At-home tests will not be accepted. Kids under age 12 can come to events without proof of vaccination or proof of a negative test. Masks are required for all guests attending Portland Athletics events.

Vaccination Requirements

- University of Portland students, faculty and staff can show their valid University ID at the entrance gate as proof of compliance with the University's COVID-19 campus vaccination policy.
- All remaining fans aged 12 and over attending University of Portland home athletic events must do one of the following to enter the facility:
 - Show CDC-issued COVID-19 vaccination card.
 - Show photo of CDC-issued COVID-19 vaccination card (cardholder must be at least two weeks past second dose of Pfizer/Moderna or first dose of Johnson & Johnson).
 - If unable to show proof of COVID-19 vaccination, must show documentation of negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 72 hours of the event or negative lab-based rapid test taken within 48 hours.
- Fans under the age of 12 do not need to show proof of vaccination.

<u>Masks</u>

In accordance with the recent mandate from Oregon Governor Kate Brown, masks are required for all spectators
ages 5 and over for both indoor and outdoor events unless actively eating or drinking.

E. Finals Site:

- 1) Gates open one hour prior to each session.
- F. <u>Administrative Complimentary Tickets</u>: Each school that participates in a state championship contest will receive the following complimentary tickets: Superintendent, 2; Principal, 2; Athletic Director, 2.
 - 1) The host school is to provide these tickets for all games prior to the finals site.
 - 2) The OSAA office will provide these tickets at the finals site. Schools may:
 - pick up their tickets at the coaches' meeting
 - pick up their tickets at the OSAA office
 - contact KT Emerson for pick up at UP
 - have their tickets sent by mail.

No additional coaches' passes will be available at the championship site. Coaches may gain admission with their OACA Gold Card and photo ID.

- 3) Administrative Complimentary tickets should be used to supervise your student sections when your team is participating.
- G. <u>Gate Lists</u>: Gate lists at home sites in excess of the complimentary ticket allotments mentioned above shall not be used. Every person in attendance must have a ticket or a pass in order to enter.
- H. Bus Drivers: Schools are responsible for all bus driver admissions. The OSAA does not provide passes for bus drivers.
- I. <u>Passes</u>: ONLY the OSAA Gold Card, OSAA VIP, OSAA Media passes, Commissioner Comp and Basketball Media passes, which will admit the bearer only with photo ID, are to be honored at any OSAA State Championship event. No school, athletic district, officials' association, etc., passes are to be accepted.

6. SUPPORT GROUPS AND ROOTER BUSES (See map for parking)

- A. <u>Cheerleaders, Dance Teams, Bands</u>: Drop off next to the Chiles Center on North Portsmouth Avenue (see map) and enter as a group through the pass gate at the main entrance.
- B. Rooter Buses: Drop off next to the Chiles Center on North Portsmouth Avenue (see map) and enter at the main entrance.

Schools bringing rooter buses will need to prepurchase tickets from the UP website. Vaccination requirements apply to all spectators 12 and older. Schools can confirm vaccination cards or negative covid tests prior to arriving at the final site. School staff accompanying students may present the list of students and the vaccination/test confirmations upon arrival, **or** please ensure that all spectators on the rooter buses have their vaccination card or negative covid test present at entry.

7. PARKING

- A. **Spectator Parking**: **The University of Portland is in school this week.** Parking will be at a premium, especially on Wednesday and Thursday. Be aware of this in order to allow plenty of time to secure parking once you arrive on campus. We will offer a shuttle from the East Campus parking lot. The shuttle will run every 15 minutes, approximately. Parking may also be available in the main lot, depending on the time of day.
- B. ADA Accessible Parking: Main parking lot adjacent to the west end of the soccer stadium/Chiles Center plaza.

11. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – SUPPORT GROUP POLICIES (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Revised Fall 2017)

Following are the support group policies as adopted by the Executive Board regarding state championships:

- A. <u>Admission</u>. Members of support groups shall be given complimentary admission from game management for contests during which their school is participating. Members shall enter the facility in uniform as a group and must be accompanied by their coach/director for verification.
 - 1) Cheerleading. The number of cheerleaders permitted is limited to members of the varsity cheer team for that sport season. Venue space, as determined by game management, may limit the number of cheerleaders able to cheer on the sideline. Squad size for routines performed prior to the contest, during timeouts and for halftime entertainment may exceed the venue sideline limit so long as the additional members return to the stands when the contest resumes.
- B. <u>Pep Band Expectations</u>. The purpose of performances by pep bands at athletic events is to entertain, promote school spirit and support cheerleaders in providing positive crowd participation activities. All members of the pep band are expected to exhibit the highest standards of good sportsmanship.

- 1) Musical selections including rhythmic percussion cadences in support of cheerleaders may be performed only during the following times:
 - a) Prior to the game.
 - b) During time outs.
 - c) Between quarters or at halftime.
 - d) Following the game.
 - e) Exceptions:
 - (1) Rhythmic percussion cadences in support of cheerleaders may be performed during play at outdoor venues only.
 - (2) No musical selections may be performed during injury time outs.
- 2) Amplified instruments are permitted at basketball contests unless the State Championship Director determines that space availability or distance to an electrical outlet precludes its use. The State Championship Director has the authority to control the volume of any amplified instrument.
- 3) If two pep bands are playing at an athletic contest, the groups shall alternate performances and split the halftime. In football, the performance time after a touchdown or point after goes to the band representing the school that has scored regardless of which band performed last. The directors of the two groups shall meet prior to the contest to confirm how the time will be shared.
- C. <u>Halftime Entertainment</u>. The following halftime procedures shall be utilized:
 - 1) Basketball.
 - a) Schools participating in the Basketball State Championships will be given first choice to entertain during halftime intermission of all basketball games. Other schools will be considered in order of application received. It shall be understood that schools not participating in the state championships shall not bring a band.
 - b) All halftime entertainment must be approved by the State Championship Director.
 - c) Individuals or groups shall provide their own equipment for music accompaniment.
 - d) Total halftime entertainment shall not exceed eight minutes.
 - e) Participating schools are to mutually agree on how the eight-minute halftime is to be shared.
 - f) The facilities will not be blacked out nor will fire of any nature be permitted for entertainment.
 - g) Individuals or groups must wear appropriate gym floor shoes.
 - h) Questions concerning halftime entertainment shall be directed to the State Championship Director.
- 12. RULE 3 CONTESTS SPORTSMANSHIP CROWD CONTROL (OSAA Handbook, Rules)
- 13. CHAMPIONSHIP GAME KEEPING STUDENTS OFF THE PLAYING FLOOR: In the past, injuries have occurred when students rushed onto the floor. We ask that you inform your student rooters that this practice will not be allowed. Schools are expected to have ample personnel available in student sections to monitor this situation. Additional security personnel will be on hand to assist in keeping students off the floor.
- 14. <u>STUDENT SECTIONS</u>: Located upstairs at each end of the court. Space will be reserved for your students at the time your team plays. This will include space for your student body, band, dance team and cheerleading squad, should these groups attend. Students should be informed to sit in these special sections when your team plays and these sections will be labeled by school as you enter the arena. Administration is expected to be near student sections. Students cannot stand on bleachers. It is expected that if students want to stand, they stand in the well between bleachers. If students do not comply, any broken bleachers will be charged to the school.
 - A. Home Team Student Section: Sections 6-10, east end of the court.
 - B. Visiting Team Student Section: Sections 16-20, west end of the court.
 - C. <u>Adults in the Student Sections</u>: The only adults allowed in the student sections listed above are the student supervisors and they shall vacate the student sections at the conclusion of their school's game.
 - D. Cheerleaders will have a designated area in front of their student section.

- **15. SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD**: This award will be presented to the school that displays the best overall sportsmanship both on and off the court. The school, coaches, players, cheerleading squads, pep bands and spectators are all considered in the judging. A special committee will choose which school is to receive this honor. Teams awarded the Sportsmanship Trophy will earn 100 points toward their school's OSAA Cup total.
- 16. <u>DAMAGE TO BACKBOARD AND/OR FACILITY</u>: Administrators are urged to inform all players and students never to grasp the net during warm-up sessions or during and after the regular game. It should be understood that if any damages are caused by students, the member school represented by such player or student shall assume all liability to replace and/or repair such damaged equipment. Further, any damage to the facility such as walls, chairs, etc. could also be charged to the school. For your school's protection, please help us inspect your student seating sections prior to and after your team plays. This could prevent your school from receiving a bill for damages.
- **17.** STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS VIDEOTAPING (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (OSAA for Media) (Revised July 2019)

Recording video of state championships from seating area is allowed provided the view of spectators is not obstructed. Use of a tripod in seating area is prohibited due to safety reasons. An official school video recorder, identified prior to an OSAA state championship event by the head coach or athletic director of a participating school, will be allowed in a designated area established by the OSAA.

NOTE: Recording video is for private use only. Broadcasting or streaming video - live or delay - is prohibited unless an online registration form has been submitted and approved by the OSAA. Those approved for broadcasting / streaming OSAA state championship events declined by the NFHS Network shall pay a rights fee to the OSAA.

- **18.** STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS BROADCASTING/STREAMING (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (OSAA for Media) (Revised July 2019)
 - A. The OSAA owns the broadcasting / streaming rights to all state championship events, first round through the championship finals. Radio and television stations, cable companies, websites and social media accounts planning to broadcast / stream games in any round of the OSAA state championships must register with the OSAA by submitting an online Registration Form. Registered and approved broadcasts / streams will be listed on the OSAA State Championship Broadcast Schedule. Those not listed will not be allowed.
 - B. For OSAA state championship events hosted by member schools, it shall be the responsibility of those registered and approved to contact the host school's athletic director to arrange for space, power and Internet access if available. The OSAA will coordinate these arrangements at all final sites and semifinal sites for football only.
 - C. NOTE: The NFHS Network is the exclusive video broadcast rights holder of OSAA state championship events. Live and ondemand video of OSAA state championship events (full or condensed versions) is strictly prohibited and in direct violation of the OSAA's agreement with the NFHS Network. Those registered and approved for broadcasting / streaming state championship events declined by the NFHS Network shall pay a rights fee to the OSAA.
 - D. Video highlights are limited to a total of two minutes per game, including broadcasts, streams and social media posts.
- **19.** <u>WITHDRAWAL FROM STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS</u> (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Revised Fall 2008)

By entering participants in a state championship meet, contest or tournament, each member school certifies that, barring injury, illness or unforeseen events, or a withdrawal to avoid violating the religious convictions of team members, the team or individuals representing the school will participate in every game or competition, that is part of that championship event, until the final conclusion of the meet, contest or championship. Any withdrawal or intentional forfeiture for reasons other than those specified shall be considered a sportsmanship violation, and shall be subject to reprimand and/or other penalties as determined by the Executive Board. See Executive Board Policies, "Withdrawal During a Competition" for more information.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS - HOME TEAM DESIGNATION (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Revised Fall 2018)

During all rounds of each OSAA State Championship bracket, the team with the better Adjusted Playoff Ranking (APR) shall be the designated home team.

2. <u>STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – TEAM SIZE</u> (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Revised Fall 2013)

A. The following limitations shall apply to replacement players and maximum team sizes for team sport State Championship events, first round through championship final. **NOTE**: Only players in uniform are allowed to participate in pre-game warm-ups.

- B. <u>Penalties for excessive team size</u>: Suiting up, warming up, or playing too many players shall be considered a gross act of unsportsmanlike conduct and may be punishable by fines, forfeiture and/or other penalties as determined by the OSAA Executive Board.
 - 1) **Basketball**. Team: Replacement of players applies to each game. A player replaced on the roster may be reinstated to the roster in subsequent games. Maximum in uniform: 6A 14; All other classifications 12.
- 3. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS ADOPTED BALL (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Fall 2010)

The OSAA shall require that the officially adopted ball for that sport be used in all state championship contests, first round through final sites.

- A. State Championship Contests at Home Sites.
 - 2) Team sports (other than football).
 - a) <u>Procedure</u>. Officials shall confirm that the game balls provided by the home team are the officially adopted balls *Wilson Evolution*). If the home team does not have the officially adopted ball, officials shall inquire if the visiting team has the officially adopted ball and use them if they are available. If neither team has the officially adopted ball, the contest shall be played, and officials shall report the violation by the host school to the OSAA.
 - b) <u>Penalty</u>. If no officially adopted balls are available for use at an OSAA state championship contest, the host school shall be subject to fines, forfeiture and/or other penalties as determined by the OSAA Executive Board.
- B. State Championship Contests Administered by OSAA Staff. Officially adopted balls (Wilson Evolution) shall be provided by OSAA staff administering the contests.
- 4. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS MEDICAL CHAIN OF COMMAND (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Effective Fall 2012)

The OSAA provides an official medical team that consists of State of Oregon registered athletic trainers and/or licensed physicians at state championship events administered by OSAA staff whenever possible. If provided, this OSAA designated medical team shall have final authority on all injury evaluations, participation status and return-to-play decisions.

FIRST ROUND THROUGH SECOND ROUND

1. EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (December 2015): www.anyonecansavealife.org

Each full member school shall have an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) in place for responding to life-threatening emergencies in after-school practices and events. Schools are strongly encouraged to utilize the "Anyone Can Save a Life" program, a free, turnkey solution that covers all medical emergencies.

2. OFFICIALS:

- A. First Round:
 - 1) <u>6A, 5A, 4A</u>: The host school is to obtain three officials from the association that services its home games. OSAA will pay the officials through *ArbiterPay*.
- B. <u>Second Round (1A and 6A only)</u>:
 - 1) <u>6A</u>: Three officials will be assigned and paid by OSAA through *ArbiterPay*.. Officials have been instructed to contact the host school AD to reconfirm game time and location prior to the day of the contest.
- C. OFFICIALS HOST SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Revised Winter 2014) for additional information.
- 3. PRACTICE: Practice time will not be available. A minimum of 30 minutes warmup will be allowed prior to a game.
- 4. GAME LOCATIONS, DATES AND TIMES: Refer to brackets for locations and home team designation. Games are to be played on the dates indicated on the brackets. Schools have the option, by mutual agreement, to change Saturday games to Friday. If schools cannot mutually agree, the game will remain as scheduled on the OSAA calendar. Game times are by mutual agreement of both participating schools. If schools cannot mutually agree, the OSAA will make the final decision. Schools are to log on to the OSAA website to enter their game time for each playoff round prior to the final site. A location for the game should only be added when the game isn't being played at the host school's campus.

A. Game Play Dates (1A, 6A)

1) Round 1 games that are scheduled during the week (Tues, Wed) are to take place on the dates scheduled on the OSAA calendar.

- **EXCEPTION**: If a school is hosting both a boys and a girls' game and all three schools involved agree, a doubleheader may be played on either play date, Tuesday or Wednesday.
- 2) Round 2 games that are scheduled on the weekend (Fri, Sat) may take place on either date provided both schools agree. If both schools do not mutually agree to change the date, the contest shall take place on the date scheduled on the OSAA calendar.

- 2. University of Portland Bag Policy / Prohibited Items: www.up.edu/events/know-before-you-go
 - Backpacks, duffle bags, or bags larger than 12 x 12 x 6 are prohibited. Please review this policy and information regarding bag checks and prohibited items (i.e., outside food and beverages, tobacco use, umbrellas, etc.). Every effort will be made to be to as quick and efficient as possible, but fans are encouraged to arrive well in advance of the scheduled start time in order to allow ample time to enter the facility.
- **3. PRACTICE TIME**: Practice time is not allowed at this state championship site for 6A teams. This restriction begins the day following the OSAA cutoff date. All practice arrangements at other sites must be made by schools. Once the tournament begins, a minimum of 15 minutes warmup will be allowed prior to a game.
- 4. <u>COACHES' MEETING</u>: A coaches' meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, March 9 at 11am (boys' coaches) and Thursday, March 10 at 11am (girls' coaches). The meeting will take place in the Hall of Fame room at the Chiles Center. All schools must have a representative at one of these meetings. <u>Head coaches</u> are encouraged to attend, and lunch will be provided.
- 5. <u>COACHES' PACKETS</u>: Packets will be available at the championship site and are to be picked up by boys' team coaches at the coaches' meeting. Packets will be available for girls' team coaches to pick up on Wednesday at the Participant Entrance, beginning at noon (you will still be expected to attend the coaches' meeting on Thursday). Each packet will contain 18 participant passes, including coaches and athletic trainer.
 - A. Schools may pick up their Administrative Complimentary Tickets at the coaches' meeting or we will place them at the event "Will Call" window in the name of the school.
 - B. No additional coaches' passes will be available at the championship site. Coaches may gain admission with their OACA Gold Card and photo ID.
 - C. Schools are responsible for taking care of any bus driver admissions.
- 6. PARTICIPATING TEAM DROP OFF AND PARKING: Team busses and vans shall drop off teams next to the Chiles Center on North Portsmouth Avenue. Parking is available for all team transportation (full size buses, mini buses, vans) at the River Campus Parking Lot only (see map). NOTE: OSAA does not provide passes for bus drivers.
- 7. <u>TEAM ENTRANCE</u>: Loading Dock entrance is located on the North Portsmouth Avenue side of the Chiles Center. OSAA issued Participant Passes are required for entry at this gate. NOTE: The University of Portland will be conducting bag checks for all entrants, including players and team personnel.
- **8. TEAM BENCH**: Seating on the bench is limited to 17 chairs, which includes players, coaches, managers, athletic trainers and team doctor. No one from your team is permitted to sit behind the benches or on the floor; they must be in the stands. In addition, each team will be given one seat at the scorer's table, next to your bench, for your scorebook or stats person.
- 9. <u>TEAM VIDEO AREA / PLATFORM ABOVE SECTION 3, UPPER LEVEL</u>: Video section passes will be issued with your team packet and your team video personnel must have the pass in order to enter this area. This pass will not allow entrance into the venue, only the video section. Cameras left unattended will be at your own risk.
- **10. DOCTOR / ATHLETIC TRAINER**: On call at each site. Teams shall provide their own first aid supplies. When called upon to evaluate an injury at the tournament, his/her decision prevails as the final decision.
- 11. **TOWELS**: Towels will not be available or issued at the championship site.
- 12. <u>COOLERS</u>: The OSAA will provide a cooler for team use at each bench at the State Championship final site. The coolers will contain water and ice. Teams are allowed to put other drinks (sports drinks, etc.) in the coolers provided by the OSAA. No other coolers will be allowed on the sidelines. <u>To prevent spills, open cups will not be permitted on the court. Water bottles are permitted and each team shall provide their own.</u>
- **13. NET CUTTING**: Cutting the net will be allowed only as part of the awards ceremony. Safety dictates that site management will provide a ladder and scissors for the championship team.

- 14. <u>SERVICE ANIMALS</u>: Trained guide dogs and service animals assisting guests are welcome at OSAA State Championships. All other animals are prohibited. All service animals must remain on a leash or in a harness, and be in full control of the handler, at all times. Handlers are responsible for any damage or injuries caused by their animals, must properly dispose of waste in appropriate containers and must take appropriate precautions to prevent property damage or injury.
- **15. LOST AND FOUND**: During the event, Lost & Found will be at the OSAA Event Office or other location designated by the host facility / OSAA Staff. After the event please contact *University of Portland Public Safety* at 503.943.7161.
- **16.** AWARDS: Team trophies will be presented at the conclusion of each trophy game on Saturday. The sportsmanship award, all-tournament team recognition, second place and championship trophies and medals and championship bracket board will be presented at the conclusion of each gender's final game Saturday evening. Teams awarded the Sportsmanship Trophy will earn 100 points toward their school's OSAA Cup total.
 - A. Trophies: Champion through sixth place trophies will be presented to the top teams in each classification.
 - B. Medals: Seventeen medals will be presented to both the champion and second place teams in each classification.
 - C. <u>OSAA All-Tournament Teams</u>: Medals will be presented to members of the All-Tournament 1st and 2nd Teams in each classification (five members on each team).
 - D. <u>Moda Health Player of the Game</u>: One player from each team in each of the 22 final site games will be recognized as that team's Moda Health Player of the Game. The winners will be announced at the conclusion of each game. Each winner will receive a commemorative coin from Moda Health and a scholarship application. Quarterfinal through semifinal winners' coins and scholarship applications will be mailed to the school the week following the championships. *Saturday's winners* will receive their coin and scholarship application during the trophy presentation.





STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – SUPPORT GROUP POLICIES

1. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – SUPPORT GROUP POLICIES (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Revised Fall 2017)

Following are the support group policies as adopted by the Executive Board regarding state championships:

- A. <u>Admission</u>. Members of support groups shall be given complimentary admission from game management for contests during which their school is participating. Members shall enter the facility in uniform as a group and must be accompanied by their coach/director for verification.
 - 1) Cheerleading. The number of cheerleaders permitted is limited to members of the varsity cheer team for that sport season. Venue space, as determined by game management, may limit the number of cheerleaders able to cheer on the sideline. Squad size for routines performed prior to the contest, during timeouts and for halftime entertainment may exceed the venue sideline limit so long as the additional members return to the stands when the contest resumes.
- C. <u>Halftime Entertainment</u>. The following halftime procedures shall be utilized:
 - 1) Basketball.
 - a) Schools participating in the Basketball State Championships will be given first choice to entertain during halftime intermission of all basketball games. Other schools will be considered in order of application received. It shall be understood that schools not participating in the state championships shall not bring a band.
 - b) All halftime entertainment must be approved by the State Championship Director.
 - c) Individuals or groups shall provide their own equipment for music accompaniment.
 - d) Total halftime entertainment shall not exceed eight minutes.
 - e) Participating schools are to mutually agree on how the eight-minute halftime is to be shared.
 - f) The facilities will not be blacked out nor will fire of any nature be permitted for entertainment.
 - g) Individuals or groups must wear appropriate gym floor shoes.
 - h) Questions concerning halftime entertainment shall be directed to the State Championship Director.
