# "A" FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP PLANS

#### Point 1 Game Dates

District Championship games to be decided by November 24th and the Championship game to be December 1st.

### Point 2 Basis for team selection.

The state shall be divided into four districts:

District 1 shall be called the Eastern Oregon District and will include the following counties: Union, Wallowa, Baker, Malheur, Umatilla, Morrow, Gilliam, Sherman, Hood River, Wasco, Wheeler, Grant and Harney.

District 2 shall be called the Southern Oregon District and will include the following counties: Jefferson, Crook, Deschutes, Lake, Klamath, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Josephine and Jackson.

District 3 shall be called the Northwestern Oregon District and will be subdivided into Northern and Southern divisions. District 3 will include the following counties: Clackamas, Columbia, Clatsop, Tillamook, Washington, Yamhill, Polk, Lincoln, Benton, Linn, Lane, Marion and Multnomah county schools outside of the Portland Public High Schools.

The Northern subdivision will include: Tillamook, Forest Grove, Hillsboro, Beaverton, Tigard, West Linn, Newberg, McMinnville, Dallas, Astoria, Seaside, Vernonia, Rainier, St. Helens, Scappoose, Columbia Prep, Parkrose, Central Catholic and Hill Military Academy.

The Southern subdivision will include: Corvallis, Albany, Lebanon, Sweet Home, Cottage Grove, Springfield, University High, Eugene, Junction City, Toledo, Salem, Milwaukie, Gresham, Oregon City, Sandy, Estacada, Canby, Molalla, Silverton, Woodburn and Mt. Angel.

District 4 will include the Portland Public High Schools.

In the sectional play-off games, District 1 shall play District 3. District 2 shall play District 4. This will be rotated each year.

Each district and subdivisions of district 3 shall have a committee of three school administrators and this committee shall meet by October 1st to work out plans for the district championship selection peculiar to that district not otherwise covered by these rules. It shall be the duty of the chairman of this committee to notify all schools in that district of the plans and send a copy to the Oregon High School Activities Association office.

### "B" FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP PLAN

#### Eleven Man

#### Point 1 Game Dates.

District Championships to be decided November 17th and Championship game to be November 22nd.

#### Point 2 Basis for team selection.

The state shall be divided into four districts:

District 1 will include the following counties: Hood River, Multnomah, Clackamas, Marion, Linn, Benton, Lincoln, Polk, Yamhill, Tillamook, Washington, Columbia and Clatsop.

District 2 will include the following counties: Lane, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Josephine and Jackson.

District 3 will include the following counties: Gilliam, Sherman, Wasco, Jefferson, Wheeler, Crook, Deschutes, Klamath and Lake.

District 4 will include the following counties: Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Baker, Grant, Malheur, Harney and Morrow.

In the sectional play-off games, District 1 shall play District 2, District 3 shall play District 4. This shall rotate each year. (In 1946 District 1 shall play District 3, and District 2 shall play District 4.)

Each district shall have a committee of three "B" school administrators and this committee shall meet by October 1st to work out plans for the district champion selection peculiar to that district not otherwise covered by these rules. It shall be the duty of the chairman of this committee to notify all schools in that district of the plans and send a copy to the Oregon High School Activities Association office.

All member schools within the district who participate in football shall vote on the district champion to represent their district. Votes to be cast for first and second choice, school receiving the majority of votes to be the winner. District Committees to poll the vote. Member schools who participate in football shall determine their vote on the following basis: teams winning the most games. Tie games to be decided by: the team registering the most first downs shall be considered the winner—if the first downs are equal then — the team registering the highest net yardage shall be declared the winner. District champions shall be determined by this tabulation.
