The district committee shall continue to represent its district in the semifinal games.

In the championship flight, tie games shall be decided as follows: the team registering the highest total net yardage shall be declared the winner-if net yardage shall be equal the team registering the most first downs shall be considered the winner.

EXCEPTION: Should the championship game end in a tie, the participating teams shall be declared co-champions.

Any team refusing to comply with these rules shall automatically forfeit the game.

The location of the semifinals and championship games shall be decided by the Board of Control.
