PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. PRE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP POSTINGS: The Master Entry list will be posted on Monday, April 8 to Tabroom.
 - a. District Tournament Directors and coaches are responsible for checking the accuracy of the entry information, including correct school, spelling of names, titles, etc.
 - b. For corrections, please contact Peter Weber at the OSAA via email at peterw@osaa.org by Wednesday, April 10 at 4pm. This will ensure that the State Championships Committee has accurate information prior to finalizing the tournament.
- 2. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS DROPS / SUBSTITUTIONS: Schools needing to drop a student who has qualified for State must complete the <u>Drops/Substitution Form</u> to notify the State Championship Committee by Wednesday, April 17. Contact Jane Berry Eddings at <u>aibe1@comcast.net</u> after April 17. Changes that are submitted are not instantaneous your patience is appreciated. <u>Please do not wait until you get to State to report a drop</u>. That would be unfair to the alternate and makes it much more difficult for the State Championships Committee to make the matching revisions often necessary under State rules to address the change.

3. **STUDENT CONGRESS REMINDERS**:

- a. Official Agenda:
 - 1) Each school with one or more State Student Congress qualifiers may submit up to two bills or resolutions as email attachments. Bills or resolutions shall be emailed to caroline.campbell@msd549c.org by Thursday, April 11, 2024.
 - 2) The Student Congress Subcommittee shall select not fewer than ten bills or resolutions to be designated as the Official Agenda for each chamber per legislative day.
 - 3) Bills and resolutions selected for the Official Agenda shall be posted to Tabroom by 4pm on the Monday prior to the Speech State Championships. <u>Bills or resolutions will be posted by 4pm on Monday, April 15, 2024.</u> Please remind student congress participants that they are expected to print the legislation packet and bring it with them to State. We will not be printing legislation for them at State.
 - 4) Bills and resolutions on the Official Agenda shall be prioritized at the preliminary session Friday morning. At the conclusion of the preliminary session, participants shall recess to prepare for the morning and afternoon sessions.
- b. Agenda Items from the Floor.

Priority. Bills and resolutions in the official packet will be considered first. In the event the Official Agenda has been exhausted, additional bills and resolutions will be provided by the State Championships Student Congress Subcommittee.

COACH INFORMATION

- 1. <u>TABROOM.COM</u>: Coaches can check their entries, participants and parents can access information throughout the championships by signing up for Live Updates at <u>osaa.tabroom.com</u>.
- 2. ADMISSION: Admission is free to spectators. The Werner University Center will open at 7am on Friday and Saturday.
- 3. PARKING (see attached parking/construction maps): Parking passes are not needed this year. Parking Lot G is reserved for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Parking Lots H and F are also reserved for Saturday. Buses need to park in Lot J. WOU will have sandwich boards with big red arrows directing everyone to the correct parking each day. NOTE: Construction on WOU's campus this Spring will close parts of Monmouth Ave and Church St. Please allow for extra time to navigate around campus.
- 4. <u>ARRIVAL PACKETS/SCHEDULES</u>: School arrival packets will be available at the Registration Desk at the Werner University Center. Entries can be found on Tabroom. Be sure all students are linked in Tabroom and have notifications on. Please remind your students to wait for <u>two judges</u> before beginning speeches in the two preliminary rounds in individual events.

5. STATE JUDGING RESPONSIBILITIES:

<u> Judge Strike Form – Deadline, Wednesday, April 17 @ 4pm</u>

- a. All coaches are expected to judge IEs, Congress and Debate if assigned. Coaches with debate entries are expected to judge debate or provide qualified judges. In addition, each school is responsible to provide 1 judge per every 4 entries. Please have your judges added in Tabroom by Tuesday, April 16. Here is a short video with instructions on how to add judges in Tabroom: https://youtu.be/kCUXVxohE7g.
- b. Coaches shall be available to judge each round. If a coach does not wish to judge during certain rounds, the coach shall bring additional judges to cover for him/her. If a coach does not fulfill assigned judging obligations without prior clearance from the Tournament Committee, the school may be subject to censure and fine by the OSAA.
- c. Schools with more than eight IE entries or two Debate entries shall provide additional judges due to size of their State entry.
- d. Coaches shall be available to judge one round past the elimination of their last student. Coaches with students remaining in competition on Saturday must be available to judge beginning with the first Saturday morning round. If there is a need for you to leave early please:
 - 1) Be sure to check with the Registration Desk to see if it would be possible, and to notify them so they do not assign you a round. This is especially important Friday night for the Saturday morning rounds. Be sure to check back in when you are available again.
 - 2) Check changes to the schedule as to when ballots will be available.
- 6. MANUSCRIPT REQUIREMENTS: Unique links to DropBox folders for each Speech District were distributed to all Directors prior to qualifying events with instructions to disseminate the links to all coaches. Coaches should have already uploaded their participant's speech from the district tournament for After Dinner Speaking, Expository, Informative, Oratory and Radio Commentary. Coaches should have also uploaded manuscripts for interpretation events including Duo Interpretation, LIELL, Humorous Interpretation, Dramatic Interpretation, POI, Poetry, and Prose. It is the responsibility of each Director to check all uploaded files for potential plagiarism. File types that can be uploaded include PDF, DOC, DOCX, etc. Please be sure that the name of the file is the participant's school followed by first and last name (i.e. Ashland John Smith).
