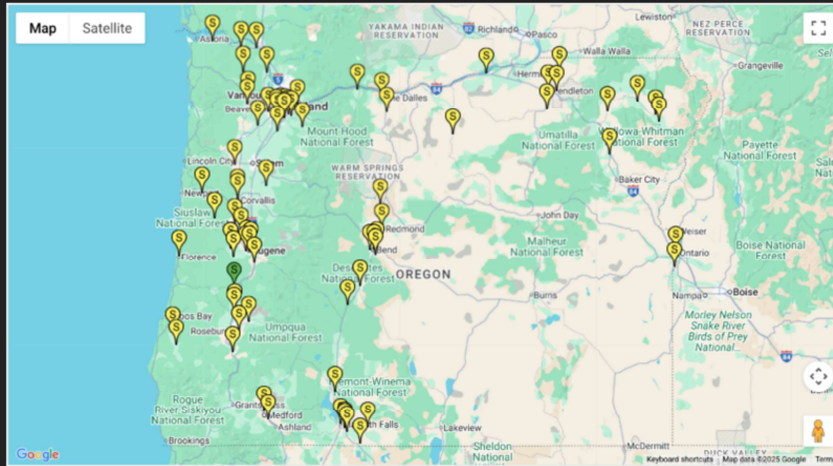

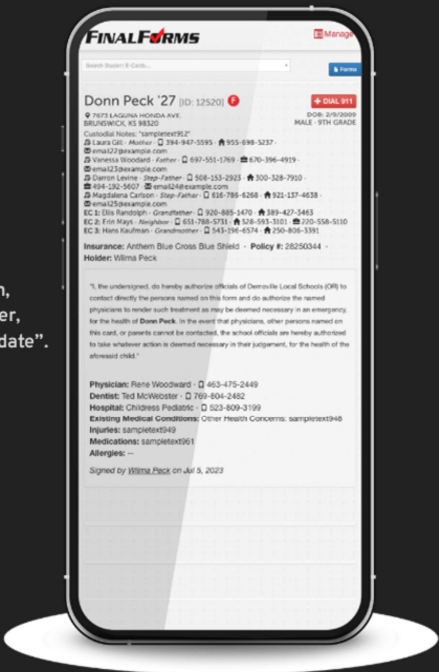

***CONSTITUTION – ARTICLES AND RULES**

A. Membership Dues – Full & Associate

B. Classification of Schools – Petition to Play Down

C. Association Year – Starting, Cutoff and Ending Dates

(Handout) Major Rule Changes for 2025-26 – not going to review all of them but a select few

- 3rd Year of 3-year plan to increase dues (up \$250 to \$2000 this year); Per activity fee up \$10 each to \$115 this year; Associate Member dues increased by 10% (2nd year of a 3-year plan)
- Petition to Play Down Task Force finished its work – adjusted Article – more responsive policy for programs that have been successful or become successful once moved down (aligns better with Football Ad Hoc Committee language)
- Extends sub-varsity cutoff dates to match latest varsity cutoff date for that sport at any classification



***BOARD POLICIES / OFFICIALS FEES**

- G. Concussion Management (HB 3007)



- New requirement last Fall for first-year ADs to attend a separate workshop in addition to the Fall Administrator Workshops
- Cleaned up language regarding timelines for when ejection reports are filed, deadlines for schools to appeal, and overall ejection process.
- Delegate Assembly approved new 3-year Officials Fee Schedule that starts this year (2025-26, 2026-27, 2027-28)
- HB 3007 passed through the Legislature this Spring, requires schools (upon written notification that a student has a concussion) to develop and implement an Immediate and Temporary Accommodation Plan (ITAP) within 10 days. A School Building Brain Injury Management Team (similar to a 504/IEP team) will determine ITAP and communicate with teachers, etc. ODE working on getting guidance out to schools. OSBA getting sample school board policy out as well.

 - *Steroids and Performance-Enhancing Substances (Every 4 years)*
 - *Concussion Recognition and Management (Annually)*
 - Cheer & Dance/Drill – Spirit Safety Clinic Certification (Annually)
 - OSAA Football Certification (Annually)

*denotes State Law Mandated Course

All certifications required prior to assuming coaching duties, paid and volunteer

FUNDAMENTALS – Required once, not about X's and O's, basics of education-based activities, OSAA Beyond the Scoreboard course recommended

CONCUSSION TRAINING – State law, required annually, recommend NFHSLearn.com course, about 30 minutes and trackable using SYNC feature on OSAA Manage Staff page

HEAT ILLNESS PREVENTION – Required every 4 years (football every year); **must** use NFHSLearn.com course and trackable using SYNC feature on OSAA Manage Staff page

STERIODS / PERFORMANCE ENHANCING SUBSTANCES – State law, required every four years; recommend NFHSLearn.com course, about 20 minutes and trackable using SYNC feature on OSAA Manage Staff page

OSAA INTERRUPTING AND PREVENTING DISCRIMINATORY ACTS – Through the OSAA website, required by OSAA Policy and Executive Board

SPIRIT SAFETY CLINIC – Required annually for all cheer and dance coaches, online course hosted by OSAA, trackable using SYNC feature on OSAA Manage Staff page, this year's course was posted last week

HEADS UP FOOTBALL – Required annually of all football coaches (paid and volunteer); includes Concussion, Heat, Sudden Cardiac, Blocking/Shoulder Tackling/Equipment Fitting, online through NFHSLearn.com and trackable using SYNC feature on OSAA Manage Staff page





CERTIFICATION

- Coach Certification
 - Soft deadline for certification will be the first practice date for each season.
 - Hard deadline/violation date will be the first contest date for each season
 - Contact Melissa Kennedy (melissak@osaa.org) for extensions regarding late hires to avoid penalties
 - Penalty (\$250)
 - Coach Certification (40 violations last year)
 - Last year partial penalties of \$125 were issued (first year)

Very important to communicate with Melissa if you have coaches who don't coach for you anymore or are on a roster for other reasons outside of coaching (like a memorial). Simply put, coaches who aren't coaching, need to be removed from your coaching roster. Anyone coaching for you, needs to be added and fully certified by the first contest date. Note, that we cannot waive or extend the concussion or steroid courses as they are state law. Please communicate with Melissa directly if you need an extension for an OSAA certification.

Make sure someone (a coach) is listed for each activity in Manage Staff.

Academic Hardship Requests

Academic requests come directly to the OSAA, to the Executive Director via email

- Will work with you and the students but need to see something from them showing they are committed to getting the job done
- 1st question asked: What did the student accomplish in summer school/online, etc.?
- 2nd question asked: What is the grad plan for this student to get back on track to graduate on time?
- Make sure the student has shown you that they are willing to put in the effort and do the work prior to sending in a hardship
- We all know that participation is good for kids but handing them eligibility without them earning it, doesn't do them any good in the long run

1st Prong

- Students must have been enrolled full time and passed the appropriate # of classes/ credits during the previously transcribed grading period (3/4, 4/5, 5/6, 5/7, 5/8)

2nd Prong

- Likewise, students must be currently enrolled full time and passing the appropriate # of classes / credits
- Classes vs. Credits – note that passing 5 classes but for only 2.0 credits doesn't meet the minimum requirement
- Credits earned in summer school may be added to the transcript and counted toward the Spring grading period
- Remember to work with your counselors to inform them of this policy, especially for seniors. Students need to be full-time students in order to be academically eligible to participate in OSAA activities.
- Academically ineligible students may practice, up to the school
- With all the different ways that students can earn credits in today's educational environment, don't hesitate to reach out to our office for help and clarification

3rd Prong

The 3rd prong is being on track to graduate per this chart:

- Students must be on track prior to the start of the school year or they are ineligible for the entire school year
- If a student isn't on track, but makes up credits during the Fall term to get back on track, they are still not eligible. You will need to email a hardship request to Peter.

Associate Member Students – don't attend your school but live in your school's attendance boundary and would like to play for you; paperwork must be filled out prior to them participating


- Make sure the school is registered with OSAA as an Associate Member
- Eligible at their resident public school only
- public charter school students must be allowed to participate per legislation (have to live in your attendance boundary, public charter school must pay a fee to the school of participation)
- Ask questions on back of certificate too, nothing worse than having to forfeit contests due to a student that doesn't even go to your school

Home School Students – law passed in 1994 allows home school students to participate

- Must be registered with ESD and live in your attendance boundaries
- Must have passed an approved test by August 15 each year (except incoming frosh) (alternative to the required test can be approved by school/district)
- Difference between home schooled and schooled at home


High School Equivalency Students – typically GED students

- Must live in your attendance boundaries
- Specific requirements for these students
- Must still be enrolled in the high school equivalency program (contact OSAA with questions)



TRANSFER STUDENTS

(Handout) **International Students** – allows students on approved CSIET program to participate

- Checklist questions allow you to determine eligibility, contact us if not sure
- Hardships go directly to OSAA using the same online Eligibility Request Form

(Handout) **Student Intent to Transfer** – protects student from affiliation only, doesn't confirm eligibility; intended to inform the student's current school and potential new school that the student plans to transfer, thereby allowing the student to receive instruction from that point forward without jeopardizing eligibility with an affiliation issue

- It doesn't mean that the student is eligible; it doesn't mean the current school supports the transfer; it doesn't mean the student is locked in to transferring and can't change their mind; it simply means the student intends to transfer, no more and no less

Eligibility Request Form – for ineligible student with circumstances beyond their control

- School has to support the initial request and complete form online (students/families can't submit this request)
- All ineligible transfer requests go to your District Committee (DC), even those with grade or on track to graduate deficiencies, DC rules on all of it
- Remember that not every student that is ineligible should be eligible; circumstances beyond the control of each of the student and student's parents

PRE-PARTICIPATION PHYSICAL EXAMS

- State Law
 - Required every two years for grades 7-12
 - Typically grades 7, 9, & 11
- Form available in 12 languages




Pre-Participation Physical Exam Form


- State law, required physical every two years grades 7-12, typically 7, 9, 11 years
- New form adopted in April 2023 must be used for any new physicals after May 2024
- We've worked with ODE to post versions in Spanish, Russian, Chinese and Vietnamese

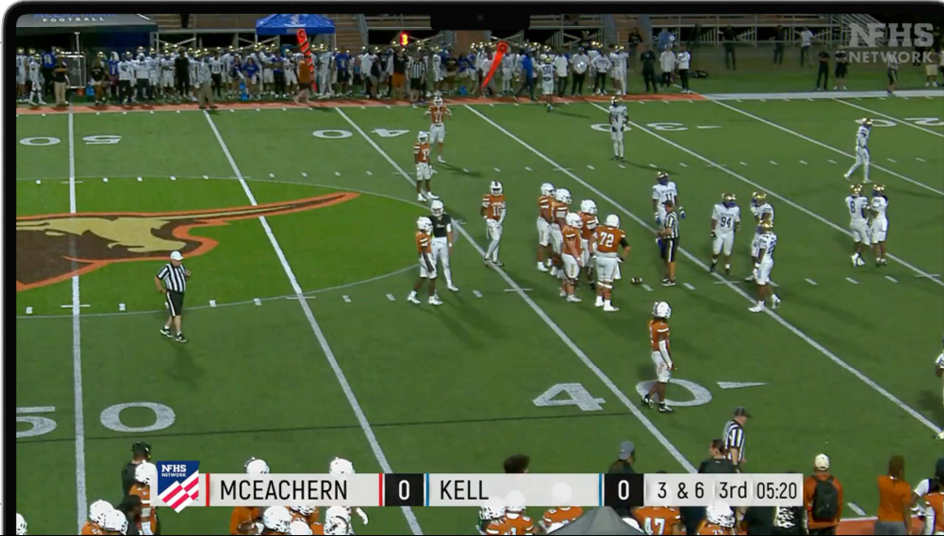
This past year, 226 schools live streamed their regular season games on the NFHS Network. And, NFHS Network distributed nearly \$165,000 back to schools in revenue share.

NFHS Network Updates

We want to share a few key updates for the upcoming Fall season.

First Down Line and Instant Replay



CLICK TO SHOW VIDEO. NEW FEATURE FOR THIS YEAR – ability to display First Down Line in Football live streams on Pixellot cameras. AND, in-game INSTANT REPLAY. No action is required by schools to have this new technology implemented – other than keeping your camera online. Our team is working through the re-calibrations required for both features and should be rolled out for all Football games by mid-season.

New Scoreboard Solutions



The largest pain-point we hear on the NFHS Network is frustration around scoreboards. We have rolled out new technology for outdoor units to capture the scoreboard even if the Scorebug device isn't plugged into the controller. Resulting in more games having scoreboard information displayed. Again, no action required other than keeping your camera online.



NEW for this year; All Varsity Football Games that live stream on the NFHS Network will generate Game Recaps and Team Highlights. These will be available to view (for free) on MaxPreps and available for schools to share/download in our HQ system.



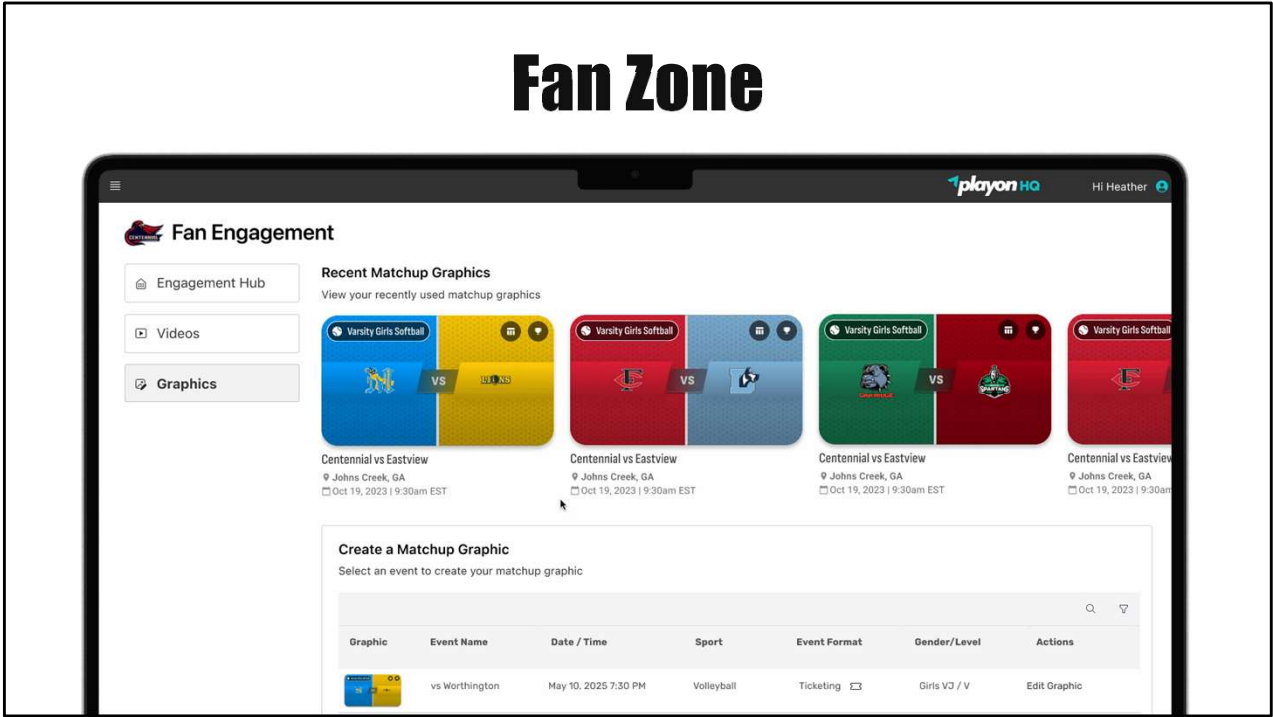
Promote Your Program and Generate Revenue

Schools across the country are looking for new ways to promote their athletic programs and generate revenue.

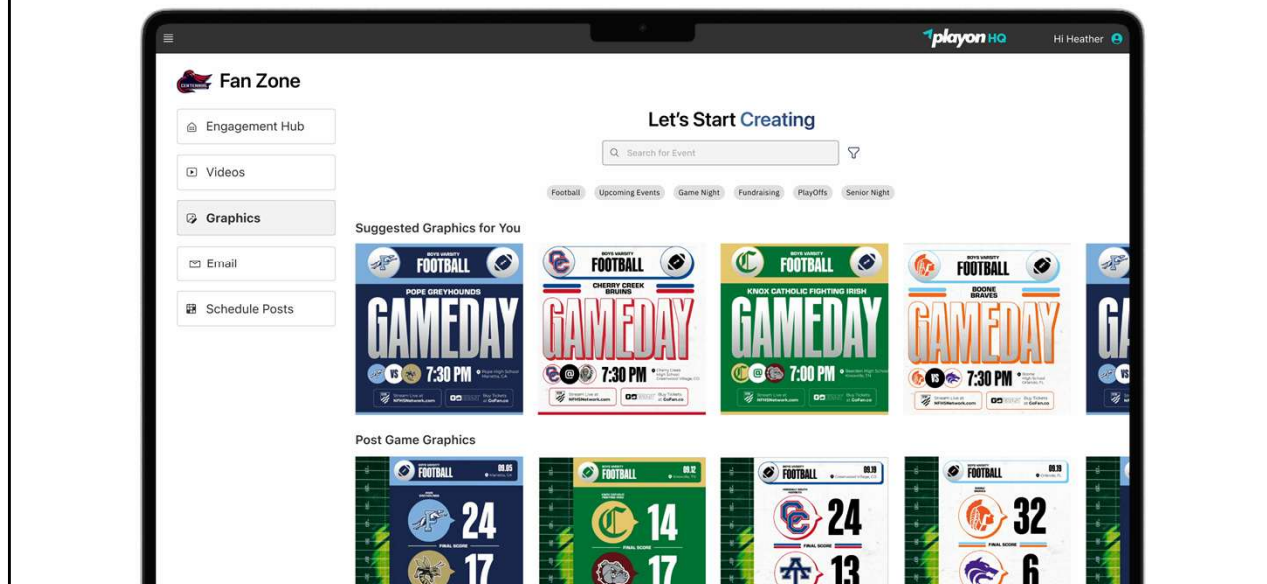

ACTIVITY INFORMATION






PRACTICE LIMITATION RULE (6A, 5A, 4A)

- Non-Instructional (Closed) Period: August 18 – September 28
 - Optional conditioning (weights, running, exercises) is the only activity allowed between out-of-season coaches and students from their high school (including freshmen)
 - No sport-specific activities/equipment permitted
- Instructional (Open) Period: September 29 – November 16
 - Limited to a maximum of six hours each week per program, not per student (including Open Facilities)
 - Allows optional, fundamental skill development with an unlimited number of student-athletes. No 8th graders or students from other schools may participate
 - No tryouts or competitions between schools permitted


Practice Limitation Rule – Non-Instructional vs. Instructional rather than Closed/Open for clarification



PRACTICE LIMITATION RULE (3A, 2A, 1A)

- **NO** Instructional (Open) or Non-Instructional (Closed) Period
 - Optional Activities Allowed:
 - General conditioning (weights, running, exercises)
 - Open Facilities with no direct instruction
- Rule of Two: two students, per program, per day (optional)
 - Receive specialized athletic instruction
 - Applies to all coaches, paid or volunteer
 - May include competition
- Baseball/Softball Pitching Exception
 - Two weeks prior to first practice date

Practice Limitation Rule – Non-Instructional vs. Instructional rather than Closed/Open for clarification



PRACTICE MODEL

- Single Practice Session
 - No longer than three hours, including warm-up and cool down
 - Maximum of one hour of weight training either before or after practice
- Multiple Practice Sessions
 - No more than five hours of total practice, including warm-up and cool down.
 - No single practice session shall be longer than three hours, including warm-up and cool down.
 - At least three hours of recovery time between practice sessions
 - During recovery time, students may not engage in other physical activities (e.g., weight training, etc.).


Outlines limits to practices – both single and multiple practice sessions (daily doubles, etc.)

PRACTICE MODEL CONT.

- Multiple Practice Sessions – Teaching Sessions
 - One practice session of the first two multiple practice days shall be a teaching session only. Conditioning drills (gassers, timed runs, or sprints) shall not be conducted.
 - The intensity, duration, and pace of all practice components shall be modified from a normal practice session.
 - The focus should be directed at developing skills fundamental to the sport at a significantly reduced pace.
 - Practice components in all activities intended to develop skills while conditioning the athlete at the same time are not allowed.




In Football, light contact with bags is allowed but Live Action situations are prohibited. Coaches are encouraged to use this “teaching session” to address offensive and defensive strategies, skill development drills and other types of team building activities that do not involve conditioning.



VOLLEYBALL

- Six total sets per day (regardless of level)
 - Does not apply to double duals or tournaments
- Wilson Nova Volleyball (red, white, and navy)

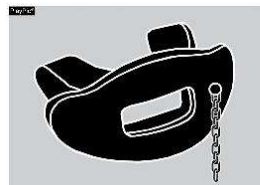
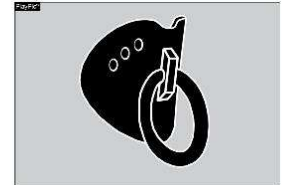
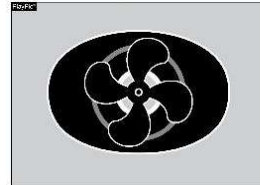


This is a new rule this year. 6 total sets. When playing a double dual or tournament this rule does not apply.

Nova will be used for this year's state tournament.

FOOTBALL

- Mouth Protectors
 - Starting in 2026, mouth protectors shall not have any attachments that do not serve a purpose and function in protecting the teeth and mouth.

- Contrasting numbers to jersey color
- When ordering new uniforms contact OSAA AED in charge of sport

When ordering uniforms please use this scale in determining your dark uniforms and the numbers on the jersey. When ordering new uniforms, please contact the Assistant Executive Director with questions. When asking; please send a mock up of the uniform, so that a determination can be made.

TrackWrestling logins will be sent out to Ads and Coaches in the beginning of November (make sure coaches are listed by then so they are added to the school account!)

Changes going to September EB Meeting:

- Teams will be required to enter weights online in their OPC following each contest (or upload from tournament)
- Growth Allowance Date changing from second Sunday in January to December 25


 **TENNIS**

- **Individual Players/Singles and Doubles – Dual, Double Dual, Tournament Match Format (Friend at Court Table 8).**
 - ***In tournament play, a student may participate in only one level of ~~competition~~ play (i.e. varsity, junior varsity) and one level of competition (i.e. singles, doubles).***
 - When all matches are best of 3 tiebreak sets students shall not compete per day in more than:
 - 2 singles matches or
 - 3 doubles matches or
 - Any combination of the two listed in USTA Friend at Court Table 8 (Scheduling guidelines for Junior Divisions; Maximum number of matches per day)
 - When all matches are played with a 10-point tiebreak in lieu of the 3rd set, short sets, or 8-game pro sets, students shall not compete per day in more than:
 - 3 singles matches or
 - 4 doubles matches or
 - Any combination of the two listed in USTA Friend at Court Table 8 (Scheduling guidelines for Junior Divisions; Maximum number of matches per day)




Changing to verify that Dual, Double Dual and Tournament format, match limitations should all be the same.

Last year they were incorrectly separated and match limitations were different. This brings it into alignment with the USTA rules, Friend at Court Table 8.

- **Required 2027** – Double First Base
- **Required 2018** – Pitch Count at All Levels

- Pitch Count violations 2024-25 (16)
- Health and Safety Violation \$250



16 pitch count violations last year. Please ensure you're accurately reporting your pitch counts into the system.

 - Optimal qualification percentage range between 30%-40%, with a low-end base of 25% and high-end cap of 45%.

State Championship Committee – putting the roster together over the next few weeks
- Group begins to meet in December/January as C&D process winds down.


It's important to remember that with this recommendation from the Championships Threshold Task Force that some activities qualifications may shrink while some, like tennis, may expand. It's important to give your feedback as the committee begins their work, right after the Classification and Districting is complete.
